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### 3.4.1 Extension activities are carried out in the neighbourhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the last five years

Understanding and identifying the needs of the local community and working to address them in order to improve it is the overarching goal of our units. It's a student-focused programme where NSS volunteers work together with several government agencies and non-governmental organisations to improve the underprivileged neighbourhood.

"NOT ME, BUT YOU" is the National Service Scheme's primary national motto. Community requirements The National Service Scheme, or NSS, was introduced in 1969, the year of Gandhiji's birth centenary, in 37 universities with 40,000 students. Its main objective was to help students develop their personalities through community service and is overseen by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. It currently exists in all Indian academic institutions and uses students to further its goals. The community's NSS volunteers carry out our institute's NSS programmes and projects in close cooperation with the community, offering a wide range of opportunities for the student to engage with the public.

#### 1. The NSS-SVPCOP regularly conduct activities

A. **Student and NSS Volunteer Orientation:** Our organisers conduct self-realization programmes to instill democratic living and selfless service among the students. This serves to familiarise the students and NSS volunteers with the fundamentals of the programmes.

B. **Campus work:** At first, NSS volunteers are permitted to participate in initiatives that are carried out for the good of the college and the involved students. These initiatives include improving access to healthcare, planting trees on the property, AIDS and smoking cessation awareness campaigns, blood donation drives, health exhibits, immunisation drives, National Youth Days, Women's Day, TB, Malaria, Cancer, and Dengue days, as well as Hb and blood tests and Mega Medical camps held on campus. A maximum of 30 hours may be worked on campus projects by NSS volunteers annually.



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C. As part of community service at SVPCOP, Hatta., this unit periodically organised free health check-up campaigns for blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar, and calcium levels. These campaigns were coordinated with the cooperation with the local administrative bodies and Primary Health Care Centre,

## 2. Unique initiatives offered by NSS-SVPCOP

This program's overarching goals are community service and education for and by the community. This kind of programme allows us to occasionally meet community needs as well as those that arise on an as-needed basis. Our NSS units take up residence in a neighbouring hamlet and spend a week visiting rural areas in an effort to foster a technological environment and assist the less fortunate in bettering themselves. It forces the students to solve the issues facing the rural community by assisting them in communicating with the locals and understanding their demands in terms of lifestyle.

### Projects in Rural Areas:

Eradicating illiteracy, agricultural operations, health camps, eye and dental health checkup camps, nutrition, hygiene, sanitation care, family life education, meeting basic needs for a rural lifestyle, campaign against social evils, plastic-free zones, literacy and crop protection, energy conservation, medical camps, upkeep of village streets and drainage, alcohol and tobacco awareness programmes, etc. are some of the common rural projects.



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
